

No indication of significant off-site PFAS impacts

To date there has been no indication of significant off-site PFAS impacts, as it relates to the Landfill. Nevertheless, out of an abundance of caution, the testing team performed a thoughtful and deliberate sampling process at select private wells in the vicinity of the site. During the first week of May, the team completed the process of collecting samples at the pre-determined private wells.

Upon collection, groundwater samples were sent to an independent testing lab for analysis with results received in late May. As part of sound scientific processes, technical experts are evaluating results to get a complete picture of off-site PFAS. These results have been shared with residents of the homes that were tested in coordination with the Health Department.

It is important to note, however, that because of the widespread presence of PFAS in the environment and use of PFAS in many products, including plumbing materials, it is possible that detections may occur that are unrelated to the Landfill.
